- provide a mix of traditional and innovative curricula
- build a Christian school community where everyone is known and valued
- retain a 'personal size' of around 150 in each year group and 300 in the Sixth Form

LEADERSHIP & TEACHING

Students are entitled to consistently high-quality teaching. At Becket Keys, we only employ exceptional teachers, all of whom must first convince us they are committed to our values, and also demonstrate their classroom skills to RET inspectors, and the Diocese.

RET provide our staff with regular, ongoing high quality inservice training, to ensure that they continually upgrade their expertise, in line with school and national expectations.

Our subject leaders are responsible for ensuring that our schemes of work and teaching are of the standard required, with our senior team regularly and systematically checking that our classroom practice delivers the quality of education that our students require.

CURRICULUM

Becket Keys delivers a personalised curriculum that draws on best practice from independent and state schools nationally.


We prepare students for life beyond school by focussing on the core curriculum and subjects that reflect the needs of the future workplace. Parents and students get impartial advice on GCSE courses appropriate for each individual, with input from universities, higher education and prospective employers.

The core GCSE curriculum: Mathematics. **English Language and Literature and Science** (including separate Biology, Chemistry, and Physics).

Other GCSEs offered include: Art. Art Textiles. Business Studies, Drama, Geography, History, Modern Languages (including Mandarin and Spanish), Music, Physical Education, Religion & Philosophy, and Technology (including Catering, Food Science and Product Design).

SIXTH FORM

Most students continue their studies with us at our Sixth Form. We take pride in continuing our Christian Ethos with regular worship and a strong focus on community service. We have maintained our independent school feel with a smart Sixth Form uniform, outstanding new facilities and special links to the best universities and employers. Keeping the Sixth Form relatively small (150 in each year), means we still know each student by name and can offer excellent pastoral care along with individualised career and higher education advice. We also continue to work closely with our expert sponsor RET to ensure the quality of our provision is second to none.

We offer a large number of A Levels including all the subjects studied at GCSE and some additional ones such as: Economics, Media, Politics and Psychology. Further details about courses can be found on our website.

School leaders have successfully recruited high-quality, motivated staff with good subject knowledge who are fully committed to the school's values and aims. All teachers are routinely monitored to check that they are teaching well and their future training needs are identified. ENRICHMENT

Curriculum enrichment in and beyond the classroom is central to Learning at Becket Keys is not just a classroom the Becket Keys' experience; each subject provides activities to activity. All staff run very popular clubs and extend learning. This includes visiting authors and artists running activities related to their subjects and their workshops, and peripatetic teachers providing tuition for a personal interests. We expect every student to take range of musical instruments. Off-site learning is also important, up some of the offers. Some activities are led by with field trips, visits to sites of historical interest, concerts, and students with particular expertise and interests, theatre trips. Year 7 students attend a 'Bushcraft' residential, Year supervised by staff. School is open from 8am until 8 students visit Madrid to practise the Spanish they learn in school, 4.30pm or later every day. and Year 9 students visit a surfing school in Bude. Our expanding programme now includes a ski trip and additional overseas visits including "World Challenge" to name a few.
